Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Hoenig at 5:15pm. Pledge of Allegiance recited.

ROLL CALL: Supervisor Hoenig, Clerk Warren, Treasurer Haag, Trustees Raduechel & Richardson present.

ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA: Motion to accept agenda by Haag, Warren supported.

MINUTES REVIEW AND ACCEPTANCE: Haag motioned to accept the meeting minutes as presented, supported by Raduechel.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: A) Two fire calls this month: 1) Debris fire at 510 W Pine St., 6 members responded 2) 1278 E Cable Lake Rd., 7 acres burned, 6 members responded. C) All 4th of July events to be held down at the park. Fundraiser for the Albino Webber Scholarship Fund will be at the park. D) Fire Chief salary raised to \$600/year plus \$20/hour, Assistant Chief to earn \$18/hour. E) Generator up and running F) County tournaments and Fire Fighter Association meeting Sat 6/13 at 9am.

WATER DEPARTMENT: A) One water bill added to taxes

CONSTABLE REPORT: A) Liquor report submitted with no violations. B) Blight issue addressed. Dumpster will be delivered to the Township by Monday for spring clean-up.

NEW BUSINESS: A) Discussion had about Township land sale near cemetery

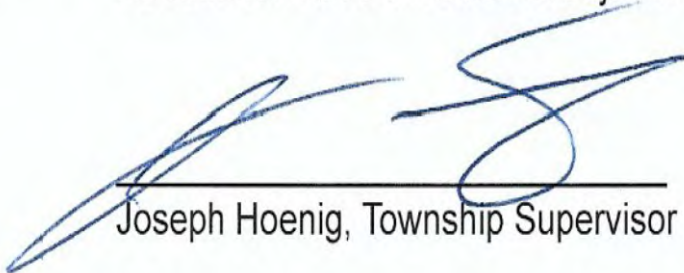
BOARD CONCERNS: A) C) Discussion had about land for sale by cemetery

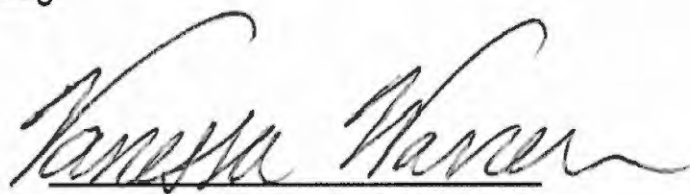
